# Principal Kellum- AASA Test Results Presentation

- CTS students exceeded the state and district averages in all grades (3rd-8th) in both ELA and math. Fourth grade (current 5th graders) scored the highest in ELA while third grade (current 4th graders) scored highest in math. Although 7th and 8th grade still out performed the state and district, it is being looked into why they scored lower than expected. This was seen across the district and state.
- 5th and 8th grade also exceeded the state and district averages on the science test.
- District ranking:
  - English Language Arts
    - CTS = 2nd highest in grade 3
    - CTS = 1st highest in grade 4-8
  - Mathematics:
    - CTS = 2nd in grades 3,6,7,8
    - CTS = 3rd in grade 5
    - CTS = 4th in grade 4
  - Science:
    - CTS = 2nd in grade 5
    - CTS = 1st in grade 8
- MTSS-A (multi tiered system of support academics) is being used for students who were not proficient or highly proficient in one or more of the subject matters tested.
  - Tier one core instruction (80% of CTS students): high quality classroom instruction, screening, and group intervention

- Tier two targeted intervention (10-15% of CTS students): explicit instruction with increased opportunities to practice and receive specific, frequent feedback
- Tier three intensive intervention (less than 10% of CTS students): specific and ongoing interventions for students that are not showing progress.
- Cheyenne Traditional School was ranked #33 in Arizona elementary schools and #7 Arizona middle school in the US News which analyzed over 100,000 Arizona public schools

### Treasurer - Heidi Nikodemus- Financial Report

- Budget income for 2024-25 school year: \$348,300
  - Membership drive: \$104,000, Adult spring fundraiser: \$100,000, Fundraising: \$35,000, School events: \$12,000, other: \$97,000
- Budget expenses:
  - Membership: \$23,620, Spring adult fundraiser: \$57,000, Harvest Fest: \$15,250, School events: \$45,900, Community support: \$24,800, Classroom/grade level/admin/school programs support: \$69,800, Spirit store/YR book/Scholastic/RP support/outreach: \$87,450, credit card fees: \$24,180
- \$100,000 for campus improvements
  - Emails were sent to teachers asking what they would like to see improved around the campus and in the classrooms
  - It was mentioned that the yellow fences should be replaced with something less unsightly. PTO will look into getting quotes.
  - It was mentioned that staff and parents would like to have the gravel in front of the school replaced with pavers to stop the kids from slipping and to create less mess. The board is getting quotes and will discuss further at a future board meeting
  - It was brought up that third grade does not have take-home math textbooks
